


Today I am going to Alys Stephens to watch a show. When we arrive, I will walk with my group/family to the building.






I will wait in line with my group/family. When it is my turn, an usher or staff member will scan my ticket and show me where I will sit.






Center staff members have name tags. If I get lost from my group/family or can't find my seat, I can ask a staff member to help me.








There are a lot of stairs in the theater. I need to walk and make sure I hold onto the rails to keep myself and everyone around me safe.


Elevators are also available if my group/family need to use them.




The Center also has sensory bags and a sensory escape area that can help me calm down. A staff member can help me find a bag or take a break at a sensory escape area.





Sometimes the show will be loud and sometimes there will be bright lights. I can use the headphones and the sunglasses in my sensory bag if the show is too loud or too bright for me.






Using the items in my sensory bag helps me to stay calm and enjoy the show with my group/family.






If I am feeling overwhelmed/nervous, I can ask to go to a quiet space. The Center staff can direct me to the closest one.






The Center also has a family restroom I can use with my group/family if I need to take a break from the show.
